Job Position: Beyond the Box Program Leader

We are seeking fun, vibrant and positive role models for the position of Beyond the Box Program Leaders to facilitate our 7-week program for youth ages 12-15.

Position Profile

The successful candidate will be deeply interested in the positive growth and development of youth aged 12-15. Beyond the Box leaders are co-responsible for a group of 6-8 participants on a weekly basis. The sessions will run weekly for 1½ hours per session. The Beyond the Box leader will ensure participant's safety, manage behaviour, and act as a positive role model and mentor. They will work directly with a co-leader at each session and maintain close contact with the Mentoring Coordinator for supervision. This program focuses on enriching physical and mental health, while building leadership skills and self-esteem.

As employers, we are committed to working to address the gaps in services and resources for underrepresented youth, including 2SLGBTQIA+ and those who may also face multiple barriers, in our community. Priority will be given to applicants who have experience supporting youth who are underserved in the community.

Key Responsibilities

- Learn the Beyond the Box curriculum and implement the outlined activities within the timeframe of each session
- Be prepared to lead each session and have all session materials organized
- Model good-sportsmanship through non-competitive games and create a positive rapport with group participants and their parents/guardians
- Become aware of all participant's dietary/medical needs and purchase snacks accordingly
- Supervise and engage participants during each session
- Set up before each session and clean the room after each session
- Complete session notes after each session and participate in regular check in's with your Mentoring Coordinator
- Other duties as assigned/required

Qualifications

- A good understanding of underrepresented youth in the community and related local community services
- The desire to work with youth and be a good role model
- Previous experience with children in a camp or educational setting preferred
- Strong communication, teamwork, and ability to problem solve effectively
- First Aid and CPR
- Valid driver's license an asset
